Joseph P. Kalt is Senior Economist of Compass Lexecon, an economics consulting firm with offices in Tucson, Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Oakland and Cambridge. He is also the Ford Foundation Professor of International Political Economy at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University and visiting professor at the Eller College of Management, The University of Arizona. In the mid-1980s, Kalt founded The Economics Resource Group, Inc. to provide expert economic analysis in matters of antitrust and regulation. The Economics Resource Group was acquired by Lexecon in 1999, and expanded to become Compass Lexecon in 2007. The company is widely regarded as the world leader in expert economic consulting, analysis and testimony. Kalt's Cambridge-Tucson offices are responsible for approximately \$40 million in annual revenues and employ 50 professionals.

With particular emphasis on the energy, transportation, insurance, and telecommunications industries, and working in the US, Canada, Australia, Asia, Latin America, Europe, and the Middle East, Kalt has provided expert economic analysis on many of the largest and most prominent antitrust, regulation, contract, and merger cases of the last twenty-five years. He is the author of numerous books and articles in his field, including *The Economics and Politics of Oil Price Regulation*, *Petroleum Price Regulation: Should We Decontrol?* (with Kenneth Arrow), and *New Horizons in Natural Gas Deregulation* (with Jerome Ellig). He has advised the governments of Spain, Thailand, China, Canada, and New Zealand, and testifies frequently before the US Congress, federal and state regulatory agencies and courts, and various international tribunals.

In his academic endeavors, Kalt is noted for his work on economic regulation and on economic development on American Indian reservations. In 1987, he founded (with Stephen Cornell) the Harvard Project on American Indian Economic Development. He continues to serve as the Project's co-director. He is a principal author of *The State of the Native Nations*, co-editor and a primary author of *What Can Tribes Do? Strategies and Institutions in the Economic Development of American Indian Reservations* (with Stephen Cornell), and a principal author of *Rebuilding Native Nations*. Kalt is also chair of Nation Building Executive Education Programs at The University of Arizona's Native Nations Institute, an institutional partner of the Harvard Project.

Joe Kalt is a native of Tucson, Arizona, graduating from Palo Verde High School in 1969. He received his Ph.D. and M.A. in economics from The University of California at Los Angeles, and his B.A. in economics from Stanford University. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of The Communications Institute, the National Advisory Board of The Big Sky Institute, and the Board of Directors of The Sonoran Institute. Joe and his wife, Judy Gans, have two children. The family owns Arrow Mountain Ranch, with cutting horse breeding and training operations in Montana and Arizona.
