



Eric Marcus is chief administrative officer of The NARBHA Institute responsible for programs, real estate portfolio, grant management, and new horizons including sustainable impact and disruptive technology. He is also responsible for the Well North Communities subsidiary, providing permanent supported housing for persons living with serious mental illness in five communities across northern Arizona, and the Sustainable Economic Development Initiative subsidiary promoting sustainable economic prosperity in northern Arizona through ecological health, social equity, and a resilient economy. Eric also serves as president of the Cottonwood-Oak Creek School District Governing Board.

Previously, Eric was chief technology and chief information officer for Commerce Clearing House, Inc. where he led a global organization with 1,300 employees and managed a budget of \$187 million.
